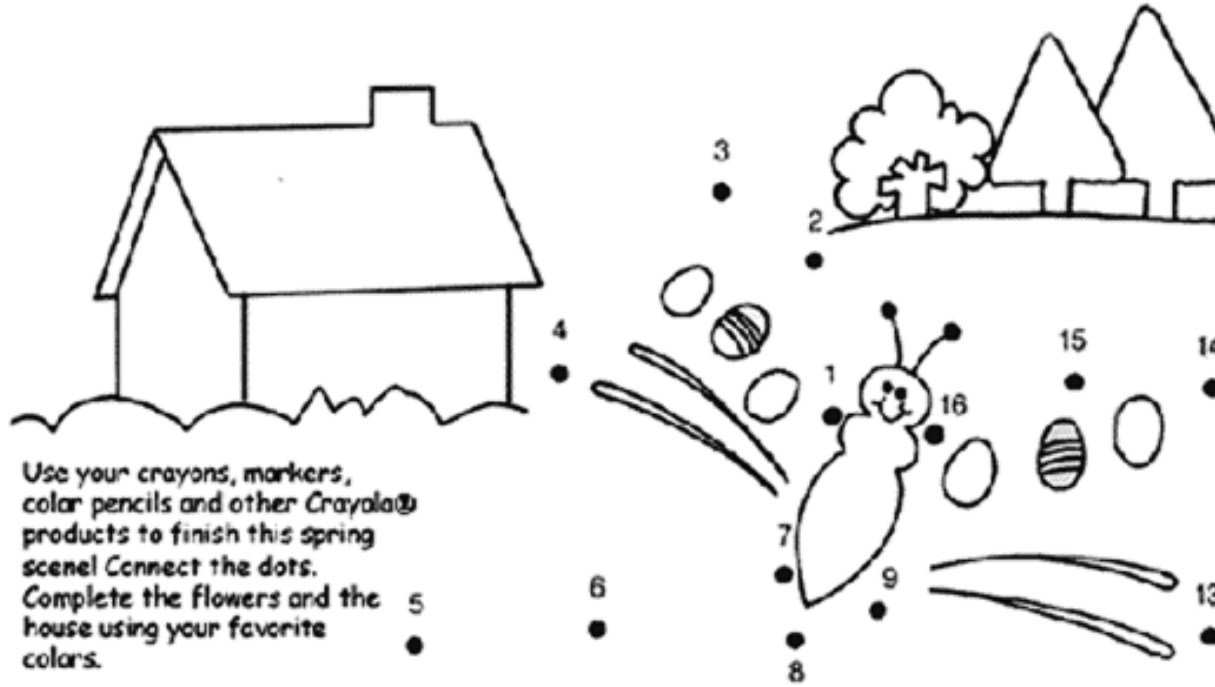


Color in Peter Cottontail

Did you know you can grow your own carrots at home from carrot tops?

Cut the top 1" off of a bunch of carrots.

Submerge the tops in water, and place in sunny (but not direct sun) location.

Change water daily.

Watch as thin, white roots begin to sprout from the orange part of the carrots. (They start forming within a couple of days.)

After a few weeks, the root structure should be substantial enough that they can be transferred to potting soil. (Carrots do best in a slightly acidic light sandy loam.)

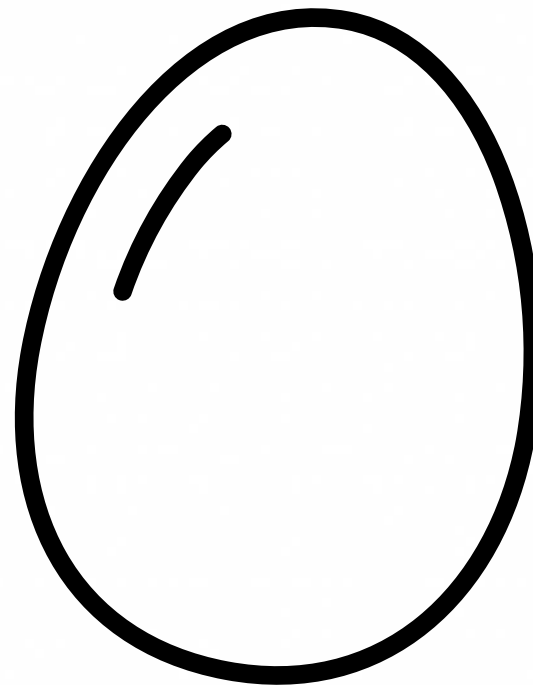
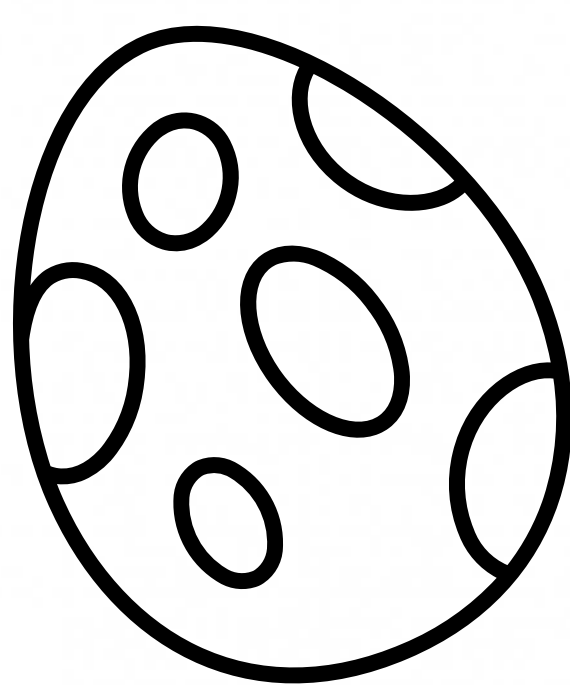
