Regional Or Private High School Students: Please note that the application and essay <u>must</u> be returned to <u>your hometown</u> mayor, <u>not</u> the mayor of the municipality where your high school is located (unless that is your hometown).

- 3. The mayor or a designated committee will select one semi-finalist from your municipality.
- 4. All entrants will receive a certificate of participation from the Mayor's office.
- 5. The winner from each municipality will be designated as a state semi-finalist. They will have their essay and application reviewed by the Scholarship Committee of the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.
- All state semi-finalists will receive a certificate attesting to their status as state semi-finalists.
- 7. The Scholarship Committee will select 15 finalists and 3 winners.
- 8. The 15 finalists will each be awarded finalist certificates. The three winners will each be awarded \$1,000.00 by their mayor at a hometown ceremony.
- 9. Winners' essays will be featured in the New Jersey Municipalities magazine.

WHAT IS THE LEAGUE?

The New Jersey State League of Municipalities is a voluntary association created to help communities do a better job of self-government through pooling information resources and brainpower. The League is authorized by state statute and since 1915, has been serving local officials throughout the Garden State. All of New Jersey's 564 municipalities are members of the League.
